Chairman R Schmeichel called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Approval of Minutes

Public Forum

Dave Peck, 594 Plummers Harbor Rd, stated he would like to speak about the Hidden Acres
agenda item. He stated that the white stripe for the walking trail on Maple Lane needs to be
repainted. G. Armstrong responded that it is on the schedule. He stated that he spoke with G.
Armstrong about lot #5 in Hidden acres, when the landscaping was completed, there is too
much dirt in the ditch and does not allow water to flow. R. Schmeichel stated this will be
discussed later.

Fire Department Quarterly Report

Fire Chief Report, 1st Quarter 2021.

- Chief King reviewed the first guarter 2021 activities in the Fire Department:
- Presented several charts of information with statistics related to Fire Department call volume in the first quarter of 2021.

- Reviewed two incidents that resulted in substantial dollar loss including a call to the Pierce Manufacturing facility on the Ogden property and at the N&M Trucking location.
- Assisted Town of Clayton in grass fires.
- Fire Department staff has been organizing the Apparatus Bay, they purchased a new clothes dryer, the used Fire Department funds to upgrade the trailer.
- The Department needs to work on their technology needs including computers, hardware etc.

Drainage at 1542 Hidden Acres Lane

Discuss Road Right-of-Way Drainage at 1542 Hidden Acres Lane

- R. Schmeichel reviewed the current drainage situation near 1542 Hidden Acres Lane and the
 past at the adjacent property where there were numerous sinkholes which were very
 challenging to correct. He property has a great deal of water pumped out through the sump
 pump adding to the sink hole problem, The solution was to install a mini storm sewer in the
 road right-of-way, which the Town paid for.
- The property at 1542 Hidden Acres Lane is not quite the same situation, the home is raised up, however it is built closer to the road as needed to avoid he wetlands. The goal is to have the ditch function properly within our MS4 guidelines while still having it look aesthetically pleasing.
- R. Schmeichel stated the estimate from Winnebago County Highway Department is \$8,300 for a mini-storm at 1542 Hidden Acres Lane.
- Melinda Cranwell, 1542 Hidden Acres Lane spoke regarding her request for the Town to install
 the mini storm sewer. She and her husband would iek to work with the Town and cost share in
 the project, she is asking for permission to install the mini storm and asking for the Town to
 share in the cost.
- G. Armstrong stated the adjoining property had an issue with sink holes and the volume of
 water they pump out of the sump pump. 1542 does not have the same issues. He is in favor
 of leaving the ditch as is, however if the Board chooses to fill in the ditch, the Town should not
 pay for that.
- General discussion about the neighborhood in general, water concerns and aesthetic concerns.
- M Cranwell stated if they are given permission, they would consider a 50-50 cost share.

Motion: G. Armstrong / B. Cardoza to approve enclosing the drainage ditch in the road right-of-way in front of 1542 Hidden Acres Lane, the Town will contract with the County to complete the work at the cost of the property owner at 1542 Hidden Acres Lane.

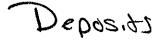

RESOLUTION 2021-09

TOWN OF NEENAH WINNEBAGO COUNTY

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE RESTORATION OF RECYCLING GRANT FUNDING

- WHEREAS, recycling provides a whole host of environmental benefits, including preserving natural resources, less air pollution, energy savings, reduced greenhouse gas emissions, reducing mining wastes and conserving landfill space; and
- **WHEREAS**, recycling also provides extensive economic benefits, providing material feedstock for manufacturing, business development, state and local tax revenue and four times more jobs than the disposal industry; and
- **WHEREAS,** the State of Wisconsin mandated recycling in 1990 under 1989 Wisconsin Act 335 and Administrative Code NR 544; and
- **WHEREAS,** Towns, Villages, Cities and Counties, hereafter Municipalities, responded by becoming Responsible Units (RUs) for Recycling and as such, invested millions of dollars in education, collection and processing infrastructure for Effective Recycling Programs; and
- WHEREAS, Brown, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties invested in Material Recovery Facilities (MRFs) and constructed a MRF in each County to serve the recycling processing needs of its residents in anticipation of the 1995 landfill bans; and
- WHEREAS, to improve the efficiencies and cost effectiveness of the three Counties' programs, Brown, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties developed and signed a Cooperative Agreement in 2002 which consolidated recycling processing operations and eliminated one MRF; and
- **WHEREAS,** in 2009 to further enhance operational efficiencies and to invest in needed technological improvements, Brown, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties consolidated all processing operations into a new, jointly-owned \$9.8 million-dollar single stream recycling MRF; and
- WHEREAS, since 2009 to further enhance operational efficiencies, expand recyclable material acceptance, and make needed technological updates, Brown, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties invested additional funding of nearly \$3.5 million dollars in the single stream recycling MRF; and
- WHEREAS, in 2021, Brown, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties contracted with Green Bay Packaging, Inc. to provide a dedicated supply of recycled fiber feedstocks to the Green Bay Mill Division, located in Brown County over the next three years; and
- **WHEREAS**, Brown, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties sell the recycled commodities collected, sorted, and processed to other buyers, a majority of which are located in Wisconsin and throughout the Midwest to support domestic recycling infrastructure; and
- WHEREAS, because the legislature recognized that implementing effective recycling programs would require financial assistance it approved the Basic Grants for RUs, the funding for which comes from a Recycling Fee, a \$7.00/ton fee charged on each ton of municipal solid waste disposed of at Wisconsin landfills. Annually \$30-\$40 million is collected as the Recycling Fee: and

WHEREAS, while the Recycling Fee dollars collected by landfills has remained consistent or increased, the money available to RUs has diminished from \$29.5 million in 2009 to \$19 million in 2020; and

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin originally proposed to cost share 66% of the Municipalities' costs for establishing and maintaining Effective Recycling Programs. The Recycling Fee Grant Funds covered 16.4% of the eligible recycling expenditures reported by Municipalities in 2018; and

WHEREAS, to build on the recycling successes of the past 30 years, to maintain local recycling infrastructure and to continue to supply local manufacturers with recycled material feedstocks, additional funding is needed for Municipalities to support the growing expense of local programs; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Town Board of Supervisors of Town of Neenah, Winnebago County hereby urges the Wisconsin Legislature and Joint Committee on Finance to restore recycling funding to the Recycling Grant to its previous base funding of \$29.5 million; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Winnebago County, Brown County, Outagamie County, Wisconsin Counties Association, Wisconsin Towns Association, League of Wisconsin Municipalities, Winnebago County State Representatives and State Senators, Joint Committee on Finance and Governor Tony Evers.

Town of Neenah Park and Trail Security Camera Guidelines

Purpose:

Establish guidelines and procedures for the use of security cameras in the Town of Neenah Parks or Trails. This guideline will be maintained by the Town of Neenah Park and Trail Committee (TNPTC) under guidance from the Town of Neenah Board of Supervisors. It shall be the intention of the TNPTC to utilize security cameras in a professional manner to support public safety objectives and law enforcement efforts.

Scope

The provisions of these guidelines apply to personnel installing, maintaining, viewing, or assisting law enforcement. All proposed changes to this guideline will be addressed by the TNPTC.

Background

In order to help ensure public safety and security, the TNPTC has installed security cameras in areas of the parks and trails. The installation of the cameras are part of the TNPTC integrated approach to provide enhanced protection for visitor safety and will provide critical supplemental assistance to law enforcement for ongoing security and public safety efforts. Security cameras are part of an effective law enforcement and security tool that can facilitate the detection, investigation, prevention, deterrence of crime, and the safety of visitors.

These guidelines establish and authorize the limited use of security cameras and the proper disposition of stored images.

Objectives.

- 1. Security cameras will be used to help ensure public safety and security; facilitate the detection, investigation, prevention and deterrence of crime.
- 2. Security cameras will be used only to visually monitor public park areas and public activities where no constitutionally protected reasonable expectation of privacy exists.

Operation and Use

- 1. Security cameras, which will also record images, will be maintained by the TNPTC or their designated subcontractor twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, in a professional manner and only to further legitimate law enforcement and public safety objectives.
- 2. No person will be targeted or monitored merely because of race, religion, gender, sex, disability, national origin and political affiliation or views.
- 3. Security camera images will not target or focus on the faces of persons engaging in constitutionally protected activity unless there is a reasonable indication of a threat to public safety or that they are engaging in criminal activity.
- 4. Disclosure and use of any information obtained will be limited to appropriate law enforcement for public safety or crime prosecution purposes.

- 5. The security camera images will be stored electronically in a secure area or locked storage device. Images will be gathered by unattended recording devices that are accessible only by authorized personnel.
- 6. Access to the security recording system will be limited to authorized law enforcement, security, maintenance, and repair personnel, whose access, with date and time information, will be approved by the Town of Neenah Administrator-Clerk-Treasurer.
- 7. Access to recorded images will be limited to authorized law enforcement and security personnel for public safety purposes and to attorneys and police managers for civil litigation and disciplinary purposes. The Town of Neenah Attorney should be consulted prior to any release of images or footage. Any footage released to the media should be approved by the Town of Neenah Board of Supervisors or Town Attorney.
- 8. Any recorded video images shall be documented and stored in a secure location with controlled access. Any recorded video images shall be retained for no more than 12 months and then destroyed unless needed as evidence for a documented criminal incident. Once the recording is no longer needed, it should be destroyed.
- 9. Upon the written approval and consent by the Town of Neenah Board of Supervisors, selected photographic stills or portions of the video recording may be reproduced and retained for historical documentation or training purposes, except that no such photograph/video still shall reveal any civilian's identity.

Accountability

- 1. Any violation of this guideline may result in appropriate disciplinary action.
- 2. Nothing in this guideline is intended to create any rights, privileges, or benefits not otherwise recognized by law. Rather, it is meant to ensure that security and video monitoring is properly used based on legally appropriate and relevant law enforcement and public safety considerations and information.

Public Notice and Comments

The TNPTC encourages public comments regarding its security camera guidelines. Please address any comments to the Town of Neenah Administrator-Clerk-Treasurer for presentation at the appropriate committee level.

Memo: Potential Road Funding Applications

For the last several weeks, Bob and I have been collecting information, attending webinars and speaking with individuals on potential funding opportunities available. The State DOT has several programs available which are in conjunction with the State budget cycles with actual funding of the projects several years out. There are application deadlines approaching that require decisions on what applications to submit based on timing of fund availability.

The three programs we are eligible for include:

Surface Transportation Program – Urban (STP) Transportation Alternative Program - (TAP) Local Roads Improvement Program - (LRIP)

We know we need to consider reconstruction of:

Larsen Road - Larsen Road from Clayton Avenue east to CTH CB Oakridge Road - Oakridge Road from CTYH CB east to the City limits

I will need McMahon's assistance to complete the applications, and we need to collaborate with the Village and NJSD on the Larsen Road project and partner with the City to complete Oakridge Road to Green Bay Road intersection.

There are no guarantees that we will be awarded the funds and funding is not immediately available, however we will know during 2022 whether or not we are awarded the funds.

We can submit as many applications as we want, These are very competitive grants, often it takes several rounds of applying before being awarded. However in conversations with McMahon and East Central, the vibe is that our two projects are very compelling and will garner points based on:

- 1- Connecting Communities
- 2- Connecting to the new high school
- 3- Creating pedestrian trails
- 4- Connecting to existing trails

A few details about each of the programs:

In all cases, we cannot begin work on the projects until the funds are available.

The questions are can we wait? And are we willing to wait? until 2026/2027 for funding? Do we apply for one or both? Do we keep them as two separate projects or combine into one? Do we apply for all the potential programs?

I continue to hear about a potential infrastructure program from the Federal government and a possibility of another MLS program later this year. Any work we do now on these applications will put us in a great position to be ready to apply should either of these two opportunities come to fruition.

If we decide to move forward with an application, East Central highly recommends that Bob and I meet with McMahon, East Central and WisDOT prior to completing an application for further guidance on the project scope and focus including how do we include NJSD and the Village into the scope of the Larsen Road project? How do we include the City in the Oakridge Road project? East Central also encourages early application rather than waiting as they will review and offer suggestions for revisions prior to the final deadline date, further improving our odds for success.

My recommendation is that we consider applying for both Larsen Road and Oakridge Road as two separate applications for as many of the programs that we are eligible for, asking for WISDOT advice and following their guidance. We will know early enough in 2022 of any awards and can start planning accordingly based on the outcome, potentially pushing off one or both projects until 2026 – 2027.
