Three Candidates for Town Board Supervisor

The Town of Neenah has three candidates on the Spring ballot vying for two Town Board Supervisor positions.

In December of 2021, Supervisor Glenn Armstrong announced that he would not run for another term as Town Board Supervisor, leaving a vacancy on the Spring 2022 Ballot. Incumbent James Weiss is running for reelection, and David Bluma and Andrea Long are running for their first term on the Town Board of Supervisors.

Prior to working at Our Savior's, she worked at Green Bay Packaging as the project administrator for the construction of their new, state of the art, recycled fiber paper mill.

With a Liberal Arts degree and two certificates (Women & Gender Studies and Global Studies) from Madison College and a bachelors from UW Green Bay due this spring, Andrea awaits response from admissions UW Oshkosh for their MPA program. Andrea is enthusiastic about the Town Supervisor opportunity to use her education, experience, passions, and knowledge for the benefit of our community.

David Bluma has been a Town resident since 2010 when he moved to the Whitetail Run subdivision. He became involved in his community by volunteering to serve on the neighborhood HOA board and has been an HOA Board member since shortly after its inception, currently holding the position of Board President. "Being on the HOA board has given me many opportunities for interaction with the Town." says David. David began attending Town Board meetings to increase his knowledge of the workings of the Town. David was appointed to the Parks and Trails Committee in 2012 and became Chair of the Committee in 2017. The Committee has worked hard to improve our parks without raising the annual

budget for a number of years. He became the Weed Commissioner in 2016 and a volunteer poll worker in 2018. David has been with his current employer for 30 years where he leads a team that schedules orders with a goal of improving throughput and reducing costs. Previously he was in the restaurant business for 25 years which lead him to a role of partner and manager, in charge of all aspects of the

business, giving him a strong background in spending wisely and controlling costs; skills that can be applied to the Supervisor position. David stated he is running for Town Supervisor because he has a desire to give back to the community in which he lives. One significant change will be in our town government board of supervisors. Glenn Armstrong has announced that after many, many years of exemplary service to the Town of Neenah, both as a volunteer fireman and Town Board Supervisor, he is stepping down and retiring. Job well done Glenn.

I would be amiss not to mention and recognize another honorable person who has served local City of Neenah government admirably, Mayor Dean Kaufert. As you know, after 8 years, he is stepping down and not running for reelection. Dean, enjoy retirement with family and friends.

An addition/donation to the Town of Neenah was made by James Keating and his family. Jim on January 25th signed over to the Town two parcels of land, totaling 10 acres, for the creation of a nature preserve for passive recreational uses by the general public including non-motorized vehicles (excluding horses) and to be named "Keating Nature Preserve". Thanks to Jim and his family.

You may have already met another welcomed addition new hire to the Town, Vicki Boushele started as Deputy Clerk-Treasurer for the Town of Neenah on December 6th 2021. Vicki's business background and pleasant personality has melded into our town office perfectly. Welcome Vicki.

Planning for future events and projects is always challenging and exciting at the same time. So it is for the Town's efforts in improving town roads. We have done our due diligence in securing Winnebago County Local Road Improvement Program (LRIP) funding of \$ 33,585, however that is a drop in the bucket of need. We are in the process of making grant applications for Federal and State road infrastructure funds. The latest program is the WisDot Federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill Funding. While the exact amount of funding is yet unknown, estimates show the opportunities and funding dollars will be significant. There are two timelines for solicitation. January and February 2022. At this writing, we are completing the February application due June 1st. Application processing and selection will occur in June and July. Albeit the Town always has several road improvement projects, our priority is a Larson Road and Oakridge Road program. "Fingers Crossed...Think Green"

ELECTION INFORMATION

Spring 2022 Election— April 5, 2022

Polls open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Polling Location: 1600 Breezewood Lane, Neenah

Sample Ballots are posted on the Town website and at the posting board at the Town Hall

If you plan to vote by absentee ballot, visit myvote.wi.gov to request your absentee ballot. It is recommended that you request your ballot early and return your ballot quickly after receiving it. Absentee ballots must be received in the Clerk's Office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

You may return your Absentee ballot in one of two ways:

- Mail: Return postage is provided with your Absentee ballot. USPS recommends mailing at least one week prior to Election day.
- **In-Person:** The person who voted the Absentee Ballot, may return it directly to the Clerk's office during regular office hours. Ballot drop boxes are not allowed at this time.

When returning your absentee ballot, your certificate envelope must include:

- Voter Signature
- Witness Signature and Witness Address

If any of these three items are missing, the ballot can not be counted. Anyone can be your witness: spouse, neighbor, friend, etc. as long as the witness is 18 years of age.

In-Person Absentee ballot requests can be made during regular office hours from March 22, 2022 to April 1, 2022.

Visit myvote.wi.gov to register to vote, see what is on your ballot, request an absentee ballot and view the status of your absentee



ballot. Redistricting was completed in 2021, resulting in 5 Wards in the Town of Neenah. All Wards vote at the Town Hall. Ward maps can be found on the Winnebago County and Town of Neenah websites.

Election Deadlines and Dates

- ♦ 3/15/22—Clerk's Office sends out ballots to those that have an absentee application on file.
- ♦ 3/16/22—Deadline to register to vote online, after this date, voters must come to the Clerk's Office to register to vote or register on Election Day
- 3/31/22 Deadline to request an absentee ballot be mailed to you. It is advised that you make your request in advance of this deadline to provide sufficient time to receive and return your Absentee Ballot .
- 4/1/22 Deadline to register to vote in the Clerks¹ office, after this date, voters must register at the polls on election day
- 4/5/22—Spring Election Day

Dog Licensing



Annual Pet licenses are required for all dogs over 5 months of age. A valid rabies certificate is required for a pet license to be issued. Dog Licenses expire each year on December 31st and should be renewed before April 1, 2022 to avoid paying a \$5 late fee. Licensing can be done in person at the Town Hall or by US mail (please include a self-addressed stamped envelope). License fees are \$5.00 for spayed/ neutered dogs and \$10.00 for unaltered dogs.

Bowmar Appraisal will notify you by US Mail if your assessed value changes. Open Book and Board of Review will beheld in May of 2022 for your 2022 property tax assessment. Dates and times will be posted to the Town of Neenah website, or contact the Town Office.



FLUSHABLE WIPES - ARE THEY REALLY FLUSHABLE?

If the label on your carton of wipes says "flushable," then wet wipes should be able to go down the toilet, right?

Unfortunately, the answer is NO! Flushable wipes are not as flushable as advertised. But people are flushing wipes down toilets—and this is causing problems.

Toilet paper is designed to disintegrate in our pipes and sewage systems, but flushable wipes are not. They're typically made with synthetic materials, plastics or polyester, that won't break down. So even if they flush down your toilet, they end up clogging our sewers. This poses hazardous risks to sewage professionals that must break these clogs up as well as considerable costs for damages to equipment and cost to clear the pipes.

While flushable wipes pose a problem for the Sanitary District and the treatment plant, property owners are not exempt from the

problems, these wipes could clog your plumbing and cause a back up in your system. You could face a bill of thousands of dollars for repairs to your plumbing system after flushing these so-called "flushable" wipes!

IN MEMORY OF CARIITA WILLIAMS



Carita Williams 1933-2022

Carita C Williams, age 88 passed away on Monday February 28, 2022. Carita spent 51 years as an elected and appointed Town of Neenah official. She began her career with the Town of Neenah in 1957 as Deputy Treasurer, working alongside her husband Bob who was the Treasurer.

Deputy Clerk was then added to her title. In 1969, Carita took over as Town Clerk when Dick Roudebush passed away. In those days, the Clerk and Treasurer positions were separate, elected positions. Carita ran for re-election every two years, and was proud to point out that she never had an opponent!

In 1997, after Carita's husband Bob died, the Town combined the offices of Clerk and Treasurer and turned it into an appointed position rather than an elected one. The Town Board appointed Carita as the Town's first Clerk-Treasurer, she served in that capacity until her retirement at the end of 2008.

The Williams' home served as the Town office from the time her husband Bob became Treasurer in 1957 until office space was added to the Town Hall on Breezewood Lane in 2007. Lakeview Elementary School served as the location for Town meetings and Elections. Many long-time Town residents remember going to Carita's house to pay their property taxes. Carita always welcomed them, inviting them in to join her at the kitchen table where she had a tray of cookies and a pot of hot coffee.

What: A meeting of a town's electors—that is, the people. The Annual Meeting should not be confused with a Town Board Meeting. While Town Board members attend the town meeting, it is not a meeting of the governing body.



A Town Elector is anyone that resides in the Town of Neenah and is eligible to vote.

The Annual Meeting provides town electors the opportunity to exercise their statutory authority over governance of the town. Powers given to the Town electors are granted by Wisconsin Statute., §60.10 and include direct powers, granting of authority, authorization to appropriate funds and take action to

advise the Town Board.

The Annual Meeting is the peoples meeting. This is your chance to let your voice be heard. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

The agenda for the Annual Meeting will include items to swear in the two recently elected Town Board Supervisors and presentation of the 2021 Financial Report. The rest of the agenda is for you, the people for input and discussion.

The Town Board and Administrator-Clerk Treasurer are reviewing Town of Neenah Municipal Code, they have already held three workshops to several chapters of the code. There will be additional workshops scheduled to complete the review. Notice of the workshops is posted to the website and posting boards, and are open to the public. The purpose of this review is to update the code which was last reviewed in 2010 and to convert to an electronic format.

Following the completion of the workshops, a draft version of the revised code will be available with an invitation for public comment. After final adoption, the new code will be available on the Town website in electronic format with a search option to easily locate a specific code.
