I am eager to learn more about the Sanitary District and how I can help serve as a commissioner to ensure it runs efficiently and continues to meet the needs of our residents. I believe my

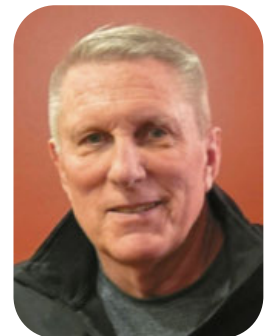
background in water and wastewater operations, combined with my experience in community service and financial management, will allow me to make a meaningful contribution to the district.

Absentee Ballot by Mail

The Clerk's Office will begin mailing absentee ballots to electors who have a valid absentee ballot request on file on March 11, 2025 and will continue mailing ballots as requests are received until the deadline.

The deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail is 3/27/2025 at 5:00 pm for regular and overseas electors and 3/28/2025 at 5:00 pm for indefinitely confined and military electors or for calendar year requests.

Completed ballots must be returned to the Clerk's Office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, April 1, 2025

As the sign indicates: Borrow, Sled, Return, Repeat!

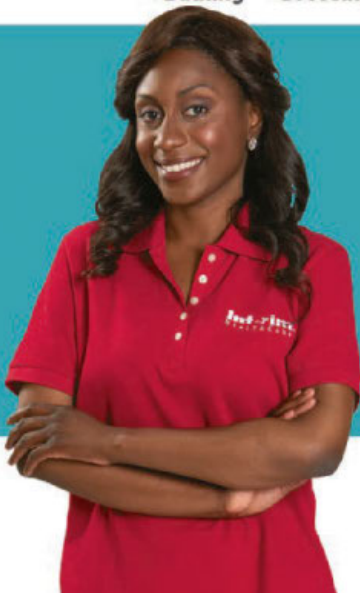

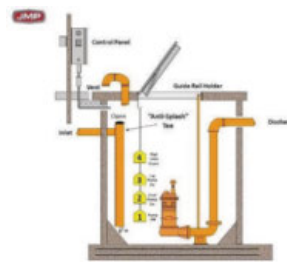
SANITARY DISTRICT #2 – LIFT STATIONS

The Town of Neenah’s sanitary sewer system serves 1100 customers and has 18.5 miles of sanitary sewer lines connected by 400 manholes. Our sewer system connects to the City of Neenah sewer system and travels to the Neenah–Menasha Wastewater Treatment Facility in Menasha. The gravity operated system utilizes 9 lift stations to maintain operation. Each lift station consists of a 20’–25’ deep “wet well” which collects the sewage from the surrounding neighborhoods.

At the bottom of the wet well is a primary pump and a secondary pump which are used to either pump the collected sewage to a higher level so it can run by gravity again or pump the sewage under pressure to the treatment plant. These pumps are critical to the continuous operation of the system. The system is monitored and maintained by Midwest Contract Operations Inc.

Two of our lift stations (#2 & #3) are our main stations which connect directly to the City of Neenah’s sewer system. These stations have dedicated generators to ensure continuous operation. The Town also owns a trailer mounted generator which can be brought to any lift station in case of a power outage.

Is your Dog Licensed for 2025 ?



By State Statute, all dogs over 5 months of age are required to be licensed annually in the Town of Neenah. License your dog before March 31, 2025 to avoid a \$5.00 late fee

The Fee is \$5.00 for spayed or neutered dogs, \$10.00 if your dog is not spayed or neutered.

Be sure to bring a copy of your rabies certificate to the Town Office when registering your furry friend (a copy is not kept on file).

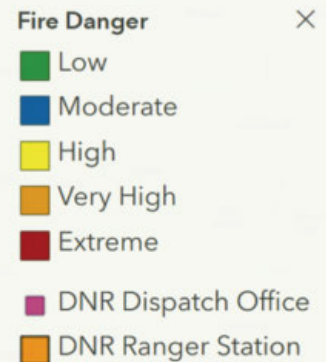
TOWN OF NEENAH FIRE DEPARTMENT

Burning in the Town of Neenah is a privilege and one of many attributes to living in the Town. However, burning of residential yard waste must be done with due regard to one's neighbor and done in a fashion that does not create a nuisance or danger to one's property or that of their neighbors. Commercial yard waste not created from one's own property, is prohibited from burning by Town ordinance as well as the Wisconsin DNR. All burning, whether it be a small campfire or a manageable brush pile of one's own yard waste MUST always be attended. Burning of one's ditch, such as tall grass, is permitted, but not recommended. A change in wind speed and direction and a small fire can ignite into a wildfire. Anytime you are burning you are taking on the responsibility and liability of the fire you created. All burning must be reported to the Winnebago County Sheriff's Office, 920-236-7300 #0 before you ignite and after the fire is extinguished.

A Google Search of "wisburn" will illustrate a map of the DNR burning conditions for Winnebago County. If you feel that a fire has become unsafe or out of control, please never hesitate to call 911, always better to be safe than sorry. The Fire Department is here to serve our community.

OPEN BOOK AND BOARD OF REVIEW

Your real estate property tax bill is based on the assessed value of your property with improvements as of January 1 of the tax year. Changes in assessment in any given year typically occur when you have made improvements to your property in the prior calendar year. Bowmar Appraisal is the Town’s contracted Assessor. If you have any questions about your property assessment, please contact them at 920-733-5369. If your assessed value changes for the 2025 tax year, you will receive a notice in the US mail from Bowmar Appraisal notifying you of your new assessment.

During the Open Book period, property owners can review their assessments and discuss any concerns directly with the assessor. This is an opportunity to resolve potential errors before moving to formal appeals process of Board of Review.

If issues aren't resolved in Open Book, property owners can appeal to the Board of Review. This board, composed of local officials, reviews the assessments and hears evidence from property owners. After considering all evidence, the board will decide whether to adjust the property's value.

The 2025 Open Book and Board of Review dates will be posted to the Town website in April 2025.

Gary and Amy have issued more than 2,300 permits including new single-family homes, remodels of kitchen, basements and everything in between, electrical, plumbing, HVAC, commercial, decks, culverts and 911 address signs. It is very likely that Gary and Amy Klinka have had something to do with structures on your property, ensuring the safety and integrity of your buildings and structures.

LARSEN ROAD RECONSTRUCTION

Larsen Road reconstruction project is scheduled for the spring and summer of 2025! The project will begin west of the CTH CB roundabout and end at the Clayton Avenue intersection. The project will improve pavement conditions, address safety issues, widen the roadway, and provide facilities for pedestrians and bicycles.

The total estimated cost of the project is approximately \$4 million. The Town will receive State funding of \$2,174,649 through the Town Road Improvement Supplemental (TRIS) Program. The Village of Fox Crossing and Neenah Joint School District will share in the cost paying for a portion of the project. The Stormwater Utility District will cost share for stormwater related work. The Town of Neenah's portion is approximately 1.1 million

The new road will consist of two 11-ft travel lanes with 5-ft paved shoulders. The north side of Larsen Road will have an additional 2 ft wide gravel shoulder in the rural portions, or a 30-inch curb and gutter in the urban section from Clayton Avenue through the Rocket Way intersection. The south side of Larsen Road will include 30-inch curb and gutter and an off road 10-ft wide paved pedestrian trail. The trail will provide a connection to the backbone trail on CTH CB. Permanent traffic signal lights will be installed at Larsen Road with cross walks for pedestrian traffic. A left turn lane will be added at Oakridge Road on the east end of the project. The speed limit on Larsen Road will remain at the posted 35 m.p.h.

As part of the project, several utilities will be relocating their services to accommodate the new road. WE Energies electric, AT&T and Charter -Spectrum will work together to relocate overhead lines to underground services. WE Energies gas will



relocates gas lines as needed. WPS will relocate utility poles at the Larsen Road / Clayton Avenue intersection. The Village of Fox Crossing will install a sewer line from Rocket Way to Clayton Avenue to accommodate future growth.

Utility work will be completed independently by each utility company prior to the start of the Town road project. This utility work will begin in March, scheduled to be completed before May 5th.

The reconstruction is planned to begin in early May. Larsen Road will be closed to thru traffic in the early part of May from Rocket Way heading east to CTH CB. Full closure from Clayton Avenue to CTH CB will be effective as of June 9, 2025. Access to Oakridge Road will remain open and access to Rocket Way from the west will remain open until June 9th. Every effort is being made to reopen Larsen Road by September 2, 2025.

Regular construction updates will be posted to the Town website once the project gets underway.

Lets keep our Town green and sustainable!

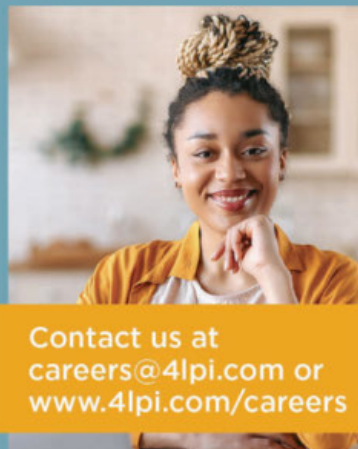

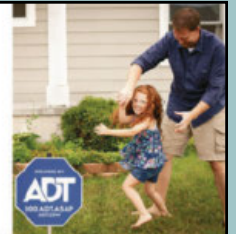

- WEIGHT LIMITS: Weight limits on Town Roads to begin in mid March. Notice will be posted to the website. Weight Limits remain in effect until weather and road condition permit. Contact the Town Office with any questions: (920)725-0916
- YARD SIGNS: Yard signs are NOT permitted in any Town Road right-of-way, including advertisements and political signs.
- PETS IN TOWN PARKS: No animals or pets other than leashed dogs are allowed in Town parks. Dogs owners are required to immediately pick up and dispose of excrement on Town park property or adjacent to Town park property.
- ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY WORK: Work in the Town road right-of-way (other than mowing) must be permitted through the Clerk's office prior to any work being performed.
- BURNING: Remember burning is permitted in the Town as set forth in Ordinance 5.05. Be respectful of your neighbors when burning. Contact Winnebago County Sheriff before and after burning (920)236-7300 #0 to avoid false alarms.
